Headteacher's News

Important Information

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Remote Learning

Thank you to the huge numbers of parents who have contacted their child's teacher to give positive feedback about the feel and style of the remote learning this time. Remote learning by definition is a broad term which encompasses any learning that takes place outside of the classroom with the teacher not present in the same place. We are very clear at OLSP that the curriculum content is vital in ensuring children do not miss out on key concepts during the lockdown. The lessons put onto Google Classroom are not educare, they are exactly the same learning that is taking place in the classroom and will ensure that all children are able to experience the curriculum they would have been taught this term if we were in school.

Class Catch Ups

These have been really successful this week and the children both in and out of school have had a lot of fun seeing their friends, listening to story time and playing some games. Teachers are also using this time to explain learning tasks to children so that they are clearer about what has been set. Please make sure you child jons these meetings - they are a great way of supporting social and emotional health during the lockdown (and will take some pressure off you to know what learning is set)

Parent Workshops

For the parents who have been able to join them this week, the workshops have provided an informal space for the teacher to talk through this week's learning so that you know how to support your child. We have been able to help parents with technical support as well as explaining what the learning tasks are and what we expect from the children in each task.

Technical Issues

We know there have been some technical issues for families accessing Google Classroom and IXL. We have purposely been using Google Classroom for homework since October half term so that the teacher and children were confident in how to use it should this situation occur again so the number of children still having problems is quite small.

Google Meet is the online meeting room that we have been using since last March for staff meetings and multi agency meetings but is quite new for the children. A quick way to unmute the microphone if your child wants to answer a question or contribute, is to tap on the spacebar.

Please email your teacher directly if you are still experiencing difficulties. One teacher did a quick tutorial this week with a parent and shared her screen to walk the parent through accessing Google Meet. We are all very happy to help.

Free School Meals

There has been much in the media this week about the quality of FSM hampers. Our staff have been out delivering hampers to those families who are eligible for FSM. Next week there will be another hamper but from Monday 25th January we are trying to organise vouchers now that the Government have decided to issue them again.
