#### **Headteacher's News**

Teachers have completed their assessments for each child across the school, met with the Leadership Team and adapted the planned curriculum for the term to ensure that this term is used to secure some of the gaps in learning due to the disruption of school closures. The Parent's Evenings being held during the 10th May week will help you to understand how we are going about supporting the children this term to prepare them for September.

# **Easter Liturgy**

All 475 children of St Nicholas and Our Lady and St Patrick's came together virtually for a shared Easter Liturgy on Friday 23rd April. We were joined by Fr Jonathan (Blessed Sacrament, Exeter) and Fr Mark (OLSP, Teignmouth) who shared the Gospel, gave us a lovely homily about new life and gave us all a special blessing at the end. The Pupil Chaplains from both schools presided over the celebration and led the prayers.



The children had created a 'Prayer Easter Egg' for the children in the other school. St Nicholas children decorated a card egg with the name of a child from OLSP, and OLSP children did the same for a child at St Nicholas. The children were so excited when they received their exchanged name and hung them on their class' Easter tree as the focal point for the liturgy. The children then prayed for each other as part of the reflection during the liturgy.





The large, bare, rustic cross was then erected outside our school symbolising the pain and despair of Good Friday. Thank you so much for all the flowers that the children brought in to decorate it with! It is a beautiful symbol that stands as a sign that Good Friday was not the end of the story and that, in Jesus' resurrection, we are given abundant life and hope.

#### Parking - Morning and Evening
