Ti C	Homework	Set on Google Classroom: Homework is posted on Friday and the spelling test will be on the following Friday.
		English: Weekly spellings are set each Friday. Each week, the children receive a list of 10 words which will focus on practising new spelling rules.
		 → Weekly spelling tests take place on Fridays. → Please make sure children are practising spellings daily where possible.
		There will be a writing task linked to the spellings for the children to complete.
		<u>Maths:</u>
		IXL activities linked to the week's classroom learning. Practice and recall will help consolidate the new learning.
		Please use TTRockstars to practise multiplication table fluency. Multiplication and division tables knowledge underpins all of the maths learning that we are covering. Fluency in times tables really does better equip the children for all new learning.
		If you need any passwords for these sites, do contact me via Dojo.
		Other: Once a half term a piece of homework linked to our topic will be set. This won't be due until the last day of each half term. This will be set alongside the weekly homework in the first week of each half term.
	Reading for Pleasure	This half term we will continue to read The Hobbit by J.R.R Tolkien as voted by class 5.
	Writing	Narrative writing The children will continue our 'Kensuke's Kingdom' extended narrative unit where they are focussing on descriptive writing including 'show not tell'. Then we will finish the half term and apply our learning from Kensuke's Kingdom to a second short narrative unit using the Talk for Writing text The Canal - a warning story.

2+3=5	Maths	Decimals and Percentages This unit will continue children's understanding of decimals, fractions and percentages. Children will develop fluency with common decimals, fractions and percentages, and will learn a range of strategies to convert between equivalent decimals, percentages and fractions. This will prepare children for more complex work with decimals, fractions and percentages in future units.
	RE	The unit of learning is called Pentecost . The children will be able to make links to show how feelings and beliefs about the use of transforming energy affects their behaviour and that of others. The children will be able to hear their own and other people's ideas about questions that are difficult to answer about transforming energy and its uses.
History	History	Ancient Greece In this unit, the children will explore the achievements of Ancient Greece, including its impact and influence on the Western World. The children will learn what the Greeks believed in and how their beliefs influenced their culture and their achievements.
Art	Art	Clay This half term the children will be exploring different techniques used in producing clay forms. The class will be visited by a local ceramicist, Emily Parr, to start off their learning using the medium of clay. Then, the children will use their Ancient Greek geography focus as inspiration as they look at different forms and surface patterns. They will consider how these forms and patterns have been developed over the years and are being used in art today. By the end of the unit they will have learnt about different techniques and experimenting with tools and materials to create different forms, textures and mark making on our own Ancient Greek inspired pots.

	RHE	Our RHE theme for this half term is: 'created and loved by God'. The teaching in this unit is based on and supplemented by a TV drama series: Paradise Street. Paradise Street is an original drama series for Upper Key Stage Two which follows the story of 4 friends – Finn, Leyla, Marcus and Siobhan – who have different personal and social experiences related to growing up and puberty. Each episode lasts about 10 minutes and is followed by a time of teacher-led discussion with the pupils. Each session also includes an episode of "Delving Deeper into Paradise Street" in which two fun presenters explore the issues in the drama and provide some teaching for pupils (which also acts as guidance and support for teachers). Each concludes with a time of personal writing which will help the children to digest and personalise the teaching. This term, the childrens' learning begins with a focus on the Gospel story 'Calming of the Storm'. The children will consider experiences of change, growth and development, and the trust that they can have in the person of Jesus through times of trial and tribulation. This is the religious and spiritual foundation for our RHE learning this term. The children will go on to learn that celebrating differences between people is enriching to a community and know that their self-confidence should arise from being loved by God. They will learn about the physical changes that boys and girls go through during puberty and how they should respect and take care of their bodies as gifts from God. Then the children will learn about pressures that they may experience from themselves, others and the media. They will develop ideas on how to build resilience through thankfulness, and learn techniques to help them manage their thoughts, feelings and actions in order to cope with new or difficult feelings such as romance and rage.
	PE	On Thursdays, the children will be learning a range of running, jumping and throwing skills in their athletics focussed PE lessons. Commencing Friday 6th May, the children will begin travelling to Dawlish Leisure centre to complete a swimming lesson each week. This will continue to take place each Friday until the end of term.
Forest School	Forest School	Class 5 will be taking part in Forest School on a Monday afternoon. Can you ensure your child brings in a change of clothes for Forest School. This is a chance for the children to explore the outdoors and learn outdoor skills.
	Computing	This half term the children will continue to learn about 3D design skills. The children will be exploring how Mars Rover moves, follows instructions, collects and sends data.
