What to do if you receive a COVID 19 positive result over the Christmas holidays.

Positive COVID 19 test result received by child or staff member who attends OLSP

Test result received on or before Thursday 24th December and <u>symptoms</u> <u>began within 48 hours of</u> <u>them being in school</u>

Test result received after Thursday 24th December OR symptoms began after 48 hours of them being in school

Contact school IMMEDIATELY by emailing office@olsp.uk

Please state the following information:

Child / staff name

Date of positive test result

Date symptoms first appeared

School do **NOT** need to be contacted.

Please follow NHS

COVID 19 advice.

Schools do NOT need to be contacted if you are self-isolating over the Christmas holidays unless you receive a positive COVID 19 test result (as above).

If you are self-isolating and this means your child will not be returning to school on Monday 4th January please email office@olsp.uk to let us know.

Only positive COVID test result emails will be responded to over the Christmas holidays.

Emails will not be checked after 3pm on Thursday 24th until the staff return to school on Monday 4th January 2021.

Please continue to keep yourselves and others safe if you have to self-isolate over the Christmas Holidays. It's a legal requirement to self-isolate if you test positive or are told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace. You could be fined if you do not self-isolate.
