Headteacher's News

We hope that you have been able to enjoy the children's Advent reflections via google classroom. It has been such a joy to see each class lead us in a daily moment of calm to prepare for Christmas. We are in the final throes of the Christmas filming and next week you will be able to enjoy the children's contributions to this years' Christmas Story - also via google classroom.

DFE announcement of Friday 18th as a Non Pupil Day

You may have heard last week that the DFE has given schools the option of closing early to children next Friday, 18th December. The Trust does not feel that this late announcement gives parents enough notice of an unforeseen school closure day. It is not a good use of valuable staff professional development time and it will not alleviate the pressure on school leaders to engage with the Test and Trace system. Therefore OLSP <u>will remain open</u> on 18th December as planned and children are expected to be in school.

Test and Trace Information - Christmas Holidays

Schools are an essential part of the track and trace system and are required to be actively involved in this during the holiday period until 24th December. It is essential that you contact us immediately if your child receives a positive test result so that we are able to alert parents within the child's class bubble. We are really hoping that this will not happen, but should your child test positive up until Thursday 24th December please email office@olsp.uk immediately. We will be checking the emails daily up until this time but, to enable staff to spend some quality time with our own families, we ask that you mark your email COVID POSITIVE CASE as we will not be opening every email during this period.

Free school meals over Christmas

Any children already registered for Free School Meals should have received a letter or email directly from Devon County Council detailing how to receive your "Free school meal over Christmas vouchers". If you think a child may now be eligible for free school meals due to a recent change in your family's circumstances, and you wish to access this holiday voucher support over Christmas please apply online through the Devon Citizen's Portal to check if you are eligible as soon as possible. This is the quickest and easiest way for their eligibility to be assessed and you will get an instant decision. Alternatively, call the education helpline on 0345 155 1019. To ensure you receive the free school meals holiday vouchers for this Christmas period you must apply by Friday 18 December 2020.
