Sometimes this might be a very light touch and only need short term support whereas for other children this might be longer term therapeutic support. It is well reported in the news that children's mental health has suffered in different ways as a result of the last 12 months whether that be through bereavement, social isolation or the result of domestic or financial struggles. Here at OLSP, we are well resourced to support children's pastoral needs. We are grateful to the Friends for additional funding which has enabled us to set up a Thrive room with resources that soothe, support sensory well-being and an environment that is nurturing.
