Sports Grant strategy statement

In 2013 the government announced new funding for school PE and sport. Our Lady and Saint Patrick's receives approximately £9000. We aim to improve the quality of PE and sport provision, so all pupils access a healthy lifestyle and reach their capabilities. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

What outcomes are we working towards?

- Outstanding PE provision across the school.
- All children to have access to competitive competition.
- Identification of able and gifted children and established pathways to local clubs/coaching.
- Greater participation in school sporting clubs.
- Encouraging all pupils towards immediate and long-term participation in sport and physical activity
- Engaging the least active pupils in school and through after school activities

- After school provision will resume in the Spring Term, Multi- Sports sessions across Key Stages and taster sessions for new sports ready for the Summer Term.
- > In school in addition to the normal PE Curriculum children from Years 1 to 6 are participating in additional sessions aimed at developing key skills and curriculum sports
- > Registers of attendance are kept by PE Co-ordinator for every event and activity and monitored by key groups E.g. boys, girls, PP/FSM, more able, low achievers, low attendance, less active, EAL and SEND
- > The Friday Flyer and SchoolComms will be the main source of information for parents combined with home letters where necessary
